


University was a castle in the sky only those with significant financial backing and their family's approval—or push—could climb to.



Perhaps as a sign of the times—this was during the rise of civil liberties and equality under Taisho democracy, after all—


some skilled individuals with no ties to imperial universities came to flourish in Bunriha.




